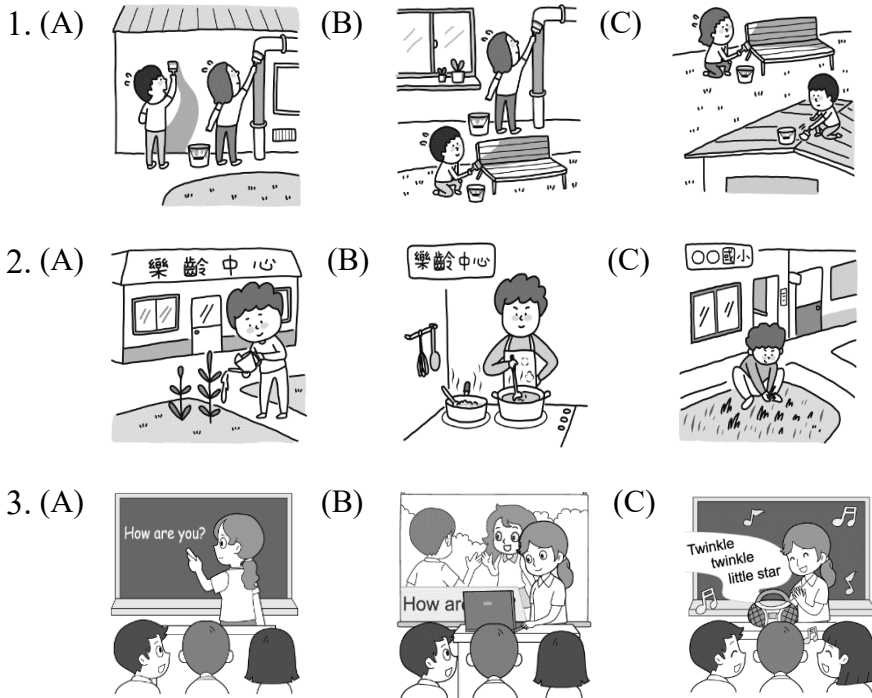

- Also, avoiding smoking and getting enough sleep are helpful for preventing dementia.

Do you know what language the Navajo speak? They speak Navajo! It is one of the most spoken languages among all the many Native American languages. There are now around 200,000 speakers in the US.

In the past, Navajo was still not a written language, so it was not known by many people outside of the Navajo Nation. That made it the perfect choice to be used as a code during World War II. Besides, there was a special group of Navajos called code talkers. They created and sent coded messages of important plans for the US. The Japanese couldn't decipher what the messages were about. In fact, they were never able to break the code.

In 2002, a story about these Navajos hit the big screen. The movie was called *Windtalkers*, and it showed how two Navajo code talkers helped the US successfully defeat Japan.
