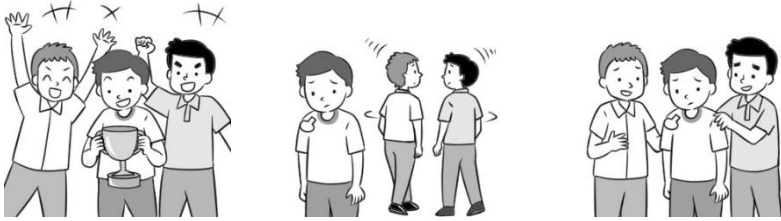

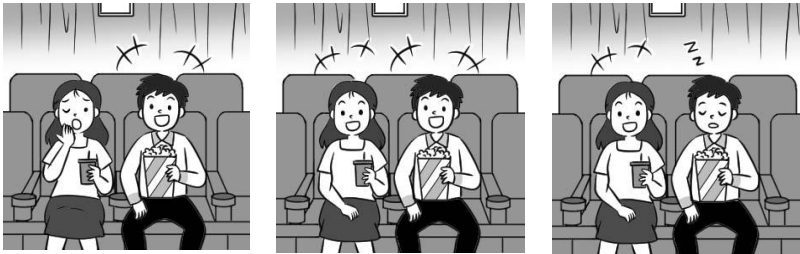

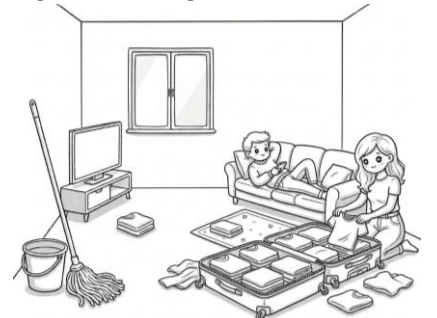

The bicycle is one of the most popular ways to get around today, but it didn't always look like the bikes we see in shops. In fact, the first "bicycle" created in 1817 by Baron Karl von Drais didn't even have pedals! It was made of wood, and riders had to push their feet against the ground to make it move. People called it the "hobby horse."

By the 1860s, things started to change. A new design called the "boneshaker" appeared. It had pedals attached to the front wheel. However, because the wheels were made of iron and wood, riding it on bumpy roads was very uncomfortable—that's why it was called the "boneshaker." Later, the "penny-farthing" became popular. It had a giant front wheel and a tiny back wheel. While it was fast, it was also very dangerous. If the bike stopped suddenly, the rider would fly over the front wheel.

Finally, in the late 1880s, the "safety bicycle" was invented. It had two wheels of the same size and a chain to help it move. This design is very similar to the modern bicycles we use today. It was much safer and easier for everyone to ride, including women and children. Today, bicycles are not only for fun but also a green way to save the planet and stay healthy.

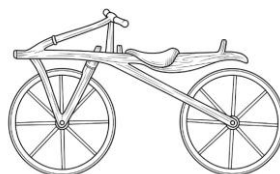

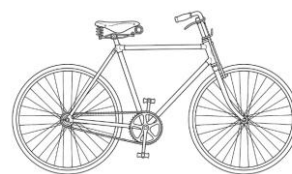

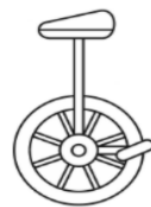
