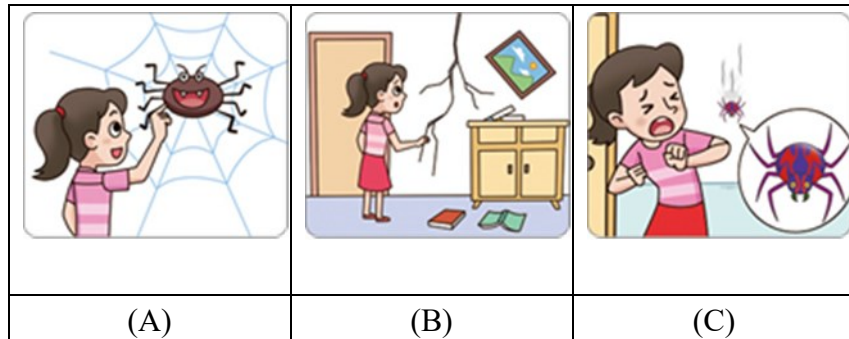

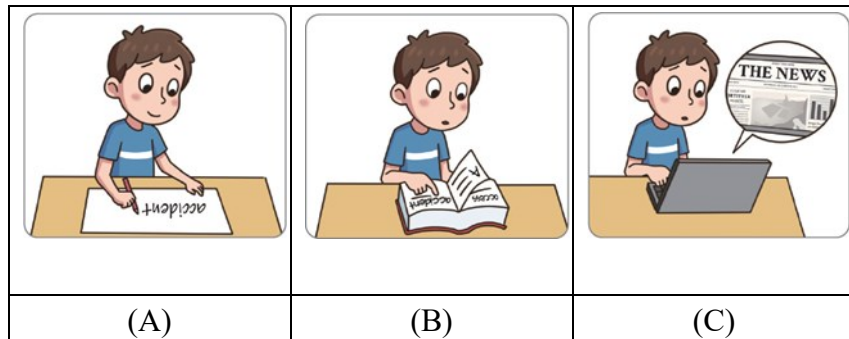

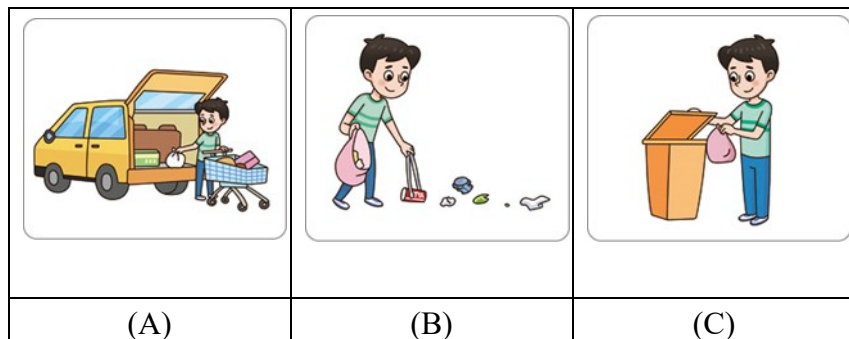

The Northern Lights are beautiful and special. If you take a trip to colder places, like Canada, Alaska, and places near the North and South Poles, you may notice long beautiful lights with different colors in the night sky from time to time. They are called the Northern Lights. They come in different colors, such as orange, red, yellow, blue, and green.

These beautiful lights come from solar wind. The solar wind gets to the earth and is turned away by the earth's magnetic field. However, sometimes a part of the solar wind enters the earth's atmosphere near the North and South Poles. When these fast moving particles hit the earth's atmosphere, they energize the gases and cause them to move along the magnetic field. That's why we can see the Northern Lights.

The lights appear in the night sky to be still or sometimes dancing, and they are different in shapes. The best time of day to see the Northern Lights is late at night or early in the morning when the sky is clear. The best time of year to see them are in early spring or fall. If you are interested in seeing them, be sure to go there at the right time.

If you enjoy reading, don't miss Shakespeare and Company when you visit the city of Paris. It is a famous English-language bookstore on the left bank of the river Seine. The first Shakespeare and Company in history was opened in 1919 by an American, Sylvia Beach. Ms. Beach did more than sell books. Her bookstore was also a library, and she even prepared beds for writers visiting there. Ms. Beach was not only kind to people but also good at choosing books, so her bookstore was often visited by writers like Ernest Hemingway and James Joyce. But in 1941, after the Germans took power in Paris, Ms. Beach was told to close her bookstore.

In 1951, another American, George Whitman, opened in Paris another English-language bookstore, Librairie Mistral. Since then, just as Ms. Beach did, Mr. Whitman has also made his bookstore a library for people to borrow books, and a free hotel for writers to stay in. To remember Ms. Beach, Mr. Whitman changed the name of his bookstore to Shakespeare and Company in 1964, two years after Ms. Beach died.

On Teacher's Day, we thank our teachers for their hard work. We also celebrated this day to remember Confucius, the great Chinese teacher from 2500 years ago. Well, that's everything we're taught about Teachers' Day. But, the first Teachers' Day was not on Confucius's birthday, and it was not about thanking our teachers.

In 1930, Mr. Tai Shuang-qiu and other teachers celebrated the first Teachers' Day in Nanjing. But there was nothing to celebrate. Teachers were paid very little and not respected. These teachers took this chance to shout out their problems. They had Teachers' Day on June 6 because the date was easy to remember and near the end of the school year. This action by Mr. Tai and the other teachers was welcomed and followed by teachers from other cities. In 1939, the government made Teachers' Day a national holiday. However, it was on August 27, the day when Confucius's birthday was celebrated. Not everyone hailed this decision: Teachers' Day was never about Confucius, and Confucius couldn't speak for all the teachers either.

One funny thing was that the government was wrong about the date of Confucius's birthday. In 1952, people found out he was in fact born on September 28. That was when we started to celebrate Teachers' Day on Confucius's real birthday.
